The following committee posts remain vacant: Deputy Chair Secretary</p> <p>AE noted that JG has agreed to take on the role of Branch Community Support Officer (Welfare) with assistance from SA and thanked them both for taking on this role.</p> <p>AE thanked KB for taking over as treasurer and noted that the year from October 2021 to 2022 had been a busy one with a very successful Poppy Appeal, Remembrance Lunch event, regular meetings schedule and most recently JG's fundraising walk which raised £2,285 for the Poppy Appeal.</p> <p>A photo was taken of JG with a large cheque for the amount of £2728.75 which will be donated to the Poppy Appeal by the branch. JG thanked the members for their support of his fundraising activities and AE told members that JG has been invited to be a standard bearer at the remembrance event in the Albert Hall in November.</p> <p>AE then read out a letter from the Green family who have made a large donation to the branch from the estate of the recently deceased Heather Green</p>

It was noted by SA that the Poppy Appeal raised around 50% of the funds required to keep the British Legion operating and that the PAO is still looking for volunteers to collect this year. AK noted that the PA was targeting schools this year and was visiting 6 primary and 2 secondary schools to raise awareness of the British Legion and the PA. ### **Copy of PAO Report**

In the year ending 30 September 2022 the total funds raised by the Poppy Appeal,  
Henley-on-Thames Community: £ 35,400  
Oxfordshire County Community: £ 554,726  
Nationally: £ 39 million (approx.)

First, may I thank our very small but dedicated team of volunteers for their hard work, and our community organisations, local businesses and various arms of the Military for their practical support. And thank you to the Branch for fundraising for the Poppy Appeal several times during the year and promoting the Henley-on-Thames community appeal.

In 2021 I also organised the Peppard Poppy Appeal till the end of the Remembrance appeal raising £2,900. At present, the Peppard Poppy Appeal Organiser position is vacant.

Since becoming the Henley Poppy Appeal Organiser in 2021 I have followed RBL’s ambition to futureproof its charitable aims by making RBL relevant to younger generations. Thus, we are collaborating with local Military bases, civilian community groups and schools. However, we do not yet have enough registered RBL volunteers to operate at our optimum capacity.

The 2021 Remembrance appeal was energetically led by Army Cadets and Gillotts school Head Students and involved RAF Benson personnel. The appeal was met with considerable community recognition, raising Henley Poppy Appeal’s profile and helping us to secure support for a well-received Armed Forces Day fundraiser with the acclaimed RAF Salon Orchestra attended by

Deputy Lieutenant Lady Hall. With Lady McAlpine’s kind help we were also able to highlight RBL’s charitable goals by fundraising for three days at the 43rd Thames Traditional Boat Festival.

The 2022 Remembrance Poppy Appeal will be launched nationally on Thursday 27 October, so in Henley, we will collect donations on private premises such as at our supermarkets and house-to-house, kicking off with an all-day collection in Tesco by the Henley Rotary Club.

On 29 October, we are arranging a Big Henley Poppy Day, collecting donations at various locations around the town. Thanks to Henley Town Council, the main fundraising activities will be held in Market Place from 10:00 to 16:00 with an RBL stall staffed by RAF Benson. We are grateful to Blandy & Blandy and Hof’s Bar for facilitating having the Waterloo Band & Bugles of The Rifles with us to help draw crowds. They will be playing from 10:30 to 12:20 and from 13:20 to 15:30.

Another special Poppy collection this year will be on Saturday 05 November in Market Place from 09:00 to 15:00, by the Berks and Oxon Military Vehicle Trust.
