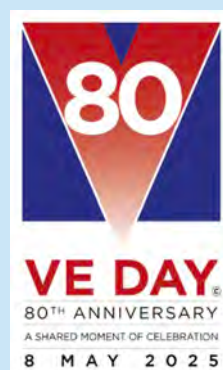

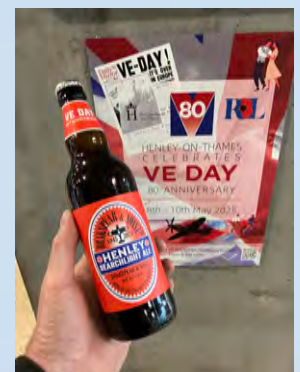

VE DAY 80TH ANNIVERSARY



The event was covered by ITV news crew who filmed during the morning.

The 80th anniversary of VE Day was marked with a spectacular three-day event from 8th to 10th May 2025, blending education, remembrance, and celebration. The town came together to honour the end of World War II in Europe, paying tribute to veterans and educating future generations about the significance of this historic milestone. The commemorations began on 8th May with an Education Day at Henley Town Hall, where over 140 primary school children participated in interactive sessions designed to bring wartime history to life. They explored what daily life was like during the war, learned about rationing, and experienced bomb siren demonstrations. The day also included wartime songs and historical readings, culminating in a traditional fish and chip lunch, a staple meal during the wartime era.

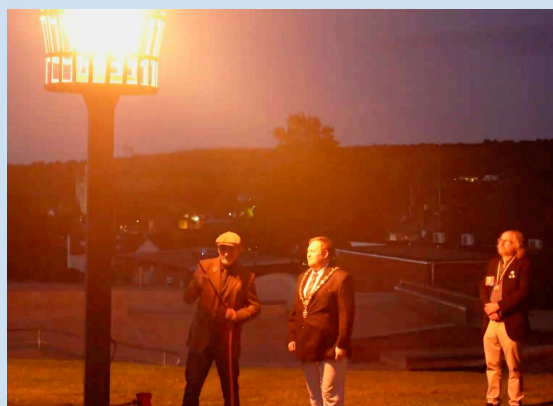
VICTORY TEA PARTY AT MENZA CAFE

The RBL committee organised a fabulous tea party at a packed Menza Cafe and the icing on the cake was a WW2 talk by Dr Michael Redley chairman of the Henley Archaeological and Historical Group on their research about how the war affected Henley and in particular ARP (Air Raid Precautions). This was open to non-members and was over subscribed to the maximum capacity of 60 people.



BEACON LIGHTING AND REMEMBRANCE SERVICE

In the evening, residents gathered at St Mary's Church for a Remembrance Service, attended by local dignitaries and cadets. John Green attended as Royal British Legion standard bearer and Richard Pinches as Chairman gave one of two readings. The service began with church bells ringing out across Henley, symbolising the resilience and unity of the community reflecting the event 80 years ago. At 9:30pm a beacon lighting ceremony was held at Makins Recreation Ground organised and lit by David Eggleton on behalf of the Gainsborough residents synchronised with similar events across the UK, creating a nationwide tribute to those who had fought for freedom.



25 YEAR AWARD

Veteran poppy collector Angelina Jones was presented with a certificate and badge to commemorate her 25 years service to the Poppy Appeal.



SWING BAND SETS TOWN HALL ALIGHT!

On 9th May, Henley Town Hall was transformed into a 1940s Dance Hall, recreating the lively wartime gatherings that once provided solace and joy amid the hardships of war. The BIG R 16-piece swing band played classic tunes, while Lindy Hop dancers performed and offered lessons to attendees eager to embrace the spirit of the era. A special address by a Sir Winston Churchill actor was delivered in true wartime style, after arriving in a military motorcade adding to the authenticity of the experience. Guests arrived dressed in 1940s attire, contributing to the immersive atmosphere. The evening's proceeds were donated to the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal, ensuring that the commemoration also contributed to supporting veterans and their families.



SPITFIRE LANDS IN TOWN CENTRE

Saturday 10th May saw Henley Market Place transformed into a living museum, offering visitors a hands-on experience of WWII history. A Mark IX Spitfire took centre stage, allowing people to admire one of the most iconic aircraft of the war. WWII military vehicles, including Jeeps and a 1930s Rolls Royce, were displayed, drawing enthusiasts and history buffs alike.



The 5th Battalion Oxfordshire Home Guard History Group reenacted scenes from wartime Britain, while Special Operations Executive Living History Demonstrations showcased espionage tactics used during the conflict. Visitors also joined guided walks led by the Henley Archaeological & Historical Group, exploring wartime landmarks such as air raid shelters, the Billeting Office, and the British Restaurant, gaining insight into how Henley adapted to the demands of war. There was a Dunkirk little ship offering river trips as well as six 'Long Beam' boats moored at Mill Meadows which held their own displays and thoroughly got into the spirit of the event.



STOP PRESS
